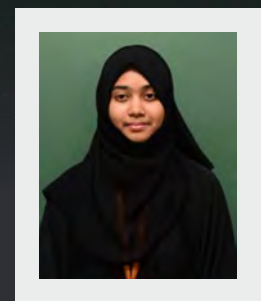
“I am the one who dwells within!”

Mustering all her spirit in a calm tone, while standing up with her eyes beaming with hope and determination, she said " the best part proof of being human is that I make mistakes".

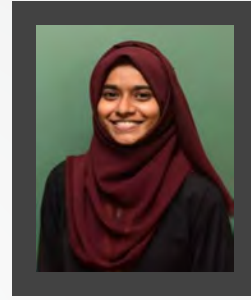
"You may have shown me the strength of a demon, but you haven't seen the strength of a human!"



“When flood comes, the fish eat ants. But when water dries, the ants eat fish. Life gives chance to everyone. Just have to wait for our turn” The theory of life logically explained by our honourable former president of India DR. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam. Life gives chance to everyone. But, utilizing that chance in right manner decides our success in life. “Take up one idea. Make that one idea your life; dream of it; think of it; live on that idea. Let the brain, the body, muscles, nerves, every part of your body be full of that idea, and just leave every other idea alone. This is the way to success, and this is the way great spiritual giants are produced.” Beautifully quoted by Swami Vivekananda, was a key figure in the introduction of the Indian philosophies of Vedanta and Yoga to the Western world. To achieve something in life first we should get success in the field where we work. But success is a fruit of slow growth. Each and every one should fight for success to achieve something in life. In this world some people are fighting just to get succeed in their life. HAWKING. Stephen Hawking was an English theoretical physicist, he has been at the forefront of thinking on cosmology, gravitation and black holes and also the director of research at the Centre for Theoretical Cosmology at the University of Cambridge. He was the Lucasian Professor of Mathematics at the University of Cambridge between 1979 and 2009. He was born on January 8, 1942 in Oxford, England, UK. Frank Hawking, was his father an English biologist; his mother was Isobel Walker, a Scottish philosophy, politics and economics graduate; both parents were graduates of the University of Oxford. Stephen had two younger sisters and one adopted brother. Stephen was an average student at school. But he shown extreme interest in the field of science and mainly in the field of mathematics and physics. At the age of 17, he awarded with scholarship in natural sciences and at age 20 he graduated with a first-class honors degree in physics from University College, Oxford. He was shown extreme research interest towards cosmology, and gravitation over particle physics. At University of Cambridge in 1962 started his PhD, he was wished to work with Dennis Sciama. At 1963, Hawking was diagnosed with an early-onset, slow-progressing form, with an incurable, rare type of a motor neurone disease amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS) (Lou Gehrig's disease). Motor neurone disease, is a progressive, usually fatal neuromuscular disease. It attacks motor neurones in the spinal cord and lower brain, which transmit signals from the brain to the voluntary muscles throughout the body. He says that “The

realization that I had an incurable disease that was likely to kill me in a few years was a bit of a shock,” But his spirit about life raised him again like phoenix bird and he stated that “My advice to other disabled people would be, concentrate on things, your disability doesn't prevent you doing well, and don't regret the things it interferes with. Don't be disabled in spirit, as well as physically”. From here he became a real warrior for his life. During second year of his PhD, he was having trouble walking and talking, but it was clear that the disease was progressing more slowly than the doctors had initially feared. Meanwhile, he stepped to his new life and married to Jane Wilde, with whom he later had three children, Robert, Lucy and Tim. Hawking started working tirelessly on gravitational waves and their likely sources (black holes), on the confirmation of the Big Bang theory, and on a theory of causal structure in general relativity, and became increasingly interested in black holes.

Stephen Hawking's biggest contributions to science

According to Hawking when a star dies, all of its mass collapses into a single point of infinite density (singularity) which leads to the formation of a black hole. A star contains information in itself, such as the speed at which it spins, its density and size. However, when a black hole collapses all that information is apparently lost. This violates the basic principle of quantum physics that information cannot be destroyed; it stays constant. Black holes are not perfectly "black" but instead actually emit particles. Hawking believed that, hawking radiation could eventually siphon enough energy and mass away from black holes to make them disappear. The theory is widely assumed to be true but was once thought nearly impossible to prove. Hawking radiation is black-body radiation that is predicted to be released by black holes, due to quantum effects near the black hole event horizon. It is named after the physicist Stephen Hawking, who provided a theoretical argument for its existence in 1974. Hawking radiation reduces the mass and rotational energy of black holes and is therefore also known as black hole evaporation. Because of this, black holes that do not gain mass through other means are expected to shrink and ultimately vanish. For all except the smallest black holes, this would happen extremely slowly. The radiation temperature is inversely proportional to the black hole's mass, so micro black holes are predicted to be larger emitters of radiation than more massive

black holes and should thus shrink and dissipate faster. He used black holes as the theoretical test bed for quantum behaviour. How would quantum fields scatter off of a black hole? His calculations demonstrated, much to his astonishment, that a black hole would show some emission, not simply scattering. This theory was introduced by Alan Guth in 1980 that in physical cosmology, cosmic inflation is a theory in which the Universe expands exponentially soon after the big bang. Further, Hawking was one of the first who calculate quantum fluctuations which means the small variations in the distribution of matter and shows that during inflation it might give rise to the spread of galaxies in the Universe. Along with Thomas Hertog, he proposed a theory "top-down cosmology" in 2006 which states that the Universe had not one unique initial state but consisted of a superposition of many possible initial conditions.

Complexity and Challenges

By the 1980s, the Hawking's marriage had become strained also his health complications increased. He could only communicate by learning to spell out words one letter at a time on a spelling card using eyebrow motions to indicate choices. It was, needless to say, exceptionally frustrating at first and required countless hours of practice. Late he grown closer to Elaine Mason, and five years later they were married, and Hawking declared: “It's wonderful, I have married the woman I love.” He has subsequently stated that several times, Elaine has saved his life. In 1982, Hawking had the idea to write a popular level book about his research on the universe, and the subsequent title, *A Brief History of Time*, was an incredible runaway best seller.

When, I started reading about his life history, I found he is the real warrior for his life and his story about life ultimately shown that disability is not an obstacle for success. In his case disability was there for only limbs and senses but not for his spirit. His overwhelmed spirit about life made his days more beautiful and successful. He shown that if a person can possess the strong and healthy will no kind of physical disability can stop them from achieving great things. Many great people in spite of disabilities excelled in their life because of their hard work, skill, discipline, spirit, creativity, patience, passion, determination, courage and perseverance. Don't accept someone else definition about your life, instead of this define your life by yourself. Every obstacle we come across in life gives us an opportunity to improve our circumstances, and whilst the lazy complain, the others are creating opportunities through their kind hearts, generosity, and willingness to get things done.

ANESTHESIA: WOUNDS WITHOUT PAIN

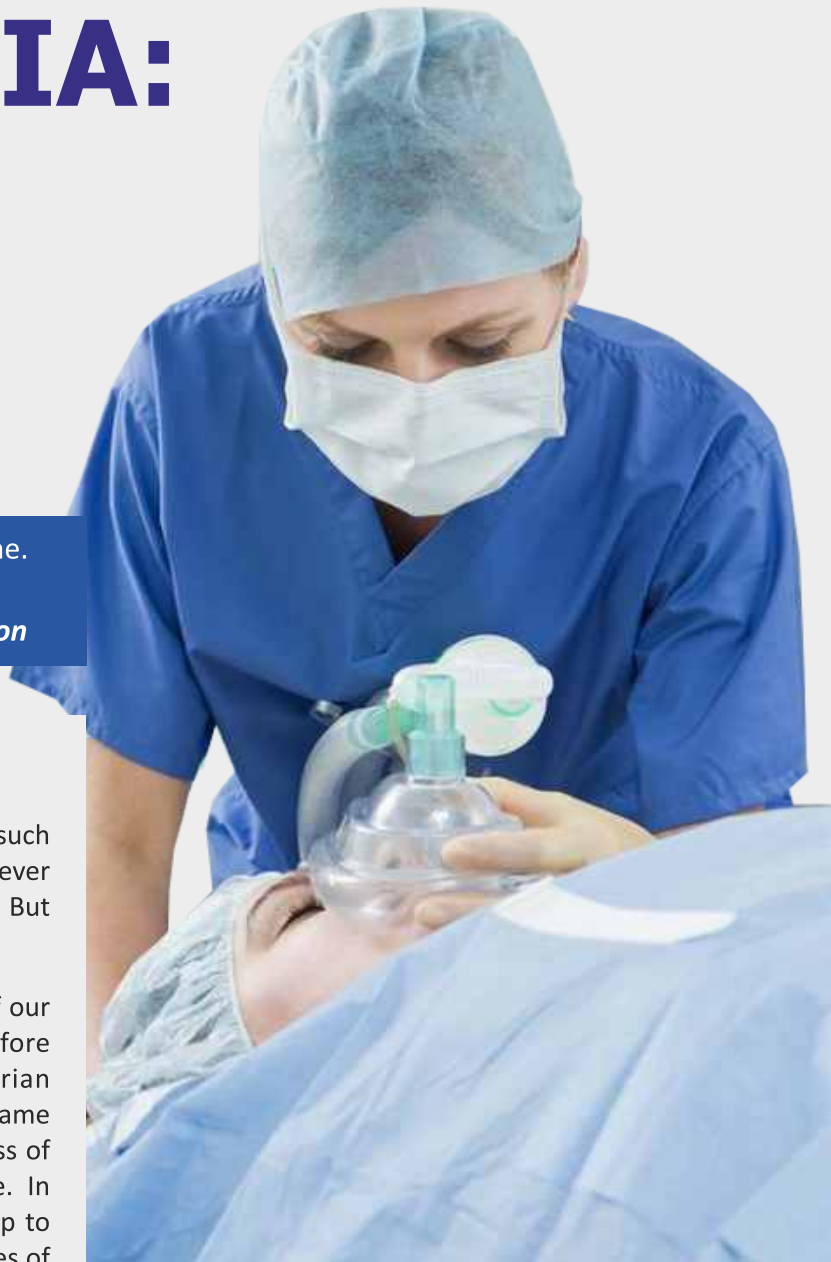
Anesthesia (C.2000 B.C.E)

(Egyptians find ways to limit pain under surgery.)

Many breakthroughs are made in modern medicine, such as open-heart surgery or joint replacement would never have been possible in a world without pain control. But how did anesthesia develop?

As it turns out, early physicians never, to the best of our knowledge, resorted to knocking people out before performing surgery. Ancient Egyptian and Assyrian physicians compressed both carotid arteries at the same time, limiting blood flow to the brain so inducing loss of consciousness of patients to conduct a procedure. In addition, Egyptians discovered that opium would help to ease pain and Assyrians used their painkilling mixtures of belladonna, cannabis & mandrake root. The Greeks and Romans copied and developed these techniques, and medieval Arabs even developed a form of inhalational anesthesia.

The advent of modern anesthesia can be traced to the latter half of the 18th century when Joseph Priestly isolated nitrous oxide. Sir Humphry Davy realized that it had anesthetic and soporific qualities, but it was considered more of an amusing way to pass the afternoon than a medical breakthrough. All that changed when a U.S dentist started using it to perform dental extractions painlessly. A few years later, diethyl ether became the anesthetic drug of choice, first for a dental procedure and subsequently for other operations. Chloroform, which had the benefit of being less flammable but that caveat of being much more likely to cause complications were used in lieu of ether in some areas.



NITROUS OXIDE ANESTHETIC (1800):

[Davy's "laughing gas" proves an effective form of pain relief]

Humphry Davy (1778-1829) first noted the anesthetic effect of nitrous oxide- a colorless, almost odorless, gas while experimenting at the pneumatic institute in Bristol, England. Davy [Best known for inventing the miner's lamp] realized that nitrous oxide made him laugh(coining the term "laughing gas") and relieved his toothache. In 1800 he published a book stating that the gas might "be used with advantage during surgical operations". After Davy's observations, nitrous oxide became popular at laughing parties and fairground shows, but it was not used in surgery for another 40 years.

At one fair in the U.S, Horace Wells, a dentist, observed a man who gashed his leg while under the influence of nitrous oxide. He seemed to be pain-free, and Wells immediately had one of his teeth removed while inhaling the gas.

In January 1845, Wells demonstrated the use of nitrous oxide in dental extractions at the Harvard medical school in Massachusetts, unfortunately, insufficient gas was applied and the patient cried out in pain. The public humiliation resulted in Wells losing of reputations as a dentist and tragically to his suicide three years later. The next year dentist William T.G Morton successfully used the gas while a surgeon removed a tumor from a man's neck and use nitrous oxide in surgery then quickly caught on in London and Paris.

Today, nitrous oxide continues to be used during childbirth and in dentistry to allay anxiety and offered some degree of analgesia.

ETHER ANESTHETIC: [1842]

(Long discovers a new medical painkiller)

The discovery of the properties of ether as an anesthetic was one of the major breakthroughs for the medical professional. Until then, patients undergoing surgery had to rely on hypnotism/ alcohol.

Long (1815-1878) is reputed to have discovered the effect of ether when attending the "laughing gas" party during his years at medical school.

Long established his rural practice in Georgia and began to experiment with sulfuric ether as an

anesthetic. The first procedure in which he used ether was in operation on March 30, 1842.

In 1849, he presented his findings and proofs of his work to the medical college of Georgia, and at the same time, he comes to know of 2 other doctors Horace Wells and Charles Jackson, who were claiming to have discovered the use of ether as an anesthetic. Although Long's results were published in 1849, he didn't receive official recognition during his lifetime. Finally on June 18th of 1879, just one year after his death, Long was credited as a father of anesthesia and remains widely respected for his work in this field.

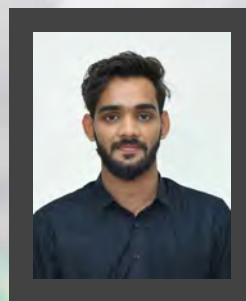
CHLOROFORM ANESTHETIC:(1847)

[Simpson eases the pain of childbirth]


James Simpson (1811-1870), Professor at University of Edinburgh, Scotland, was the first doctor to use chloroform in childbirth, he was dissatisfied with the use of ether and set about finding an alternative, Using himself, friends as guinea pigs. On November 1847, the group tried chloroform, when Simpson's wife on bringing in dinner, the handkerchief was being passed around and one by one the members applied it to their faces. And found them all asleep under the table. Sir James Young Simpson first used the sweet-smelling, colorless, and non-flammable liquid as an anesthetic that can be easily administered.

Chloroform did not become widely established until 1853 when Queen Victoria used it for the delivery of her last child.

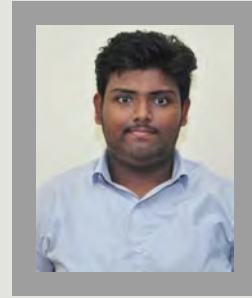
The use of chloroform anesthetic was abandoned in the early 20th century when it was shown to be responsible for several fatal heart attacks.

Various areas required in the production process of tablets, powders, liquid orals, semisolids, and quality control labs were shown to the students.





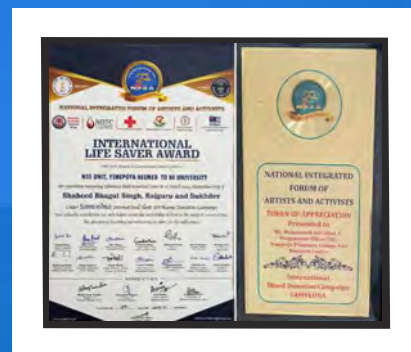
Not Me, But You...!
